Head Teacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Wow! What an amazing Springfield week we have had with so many exciting adventures through history. Each class has been looking at specific past events ranging from the Egyptians, Tudors and Romans to the history of flight and Kings and Queens. The children have been so excited to explore and investigate the past through stories, independent learning and a range of magnificent resources including Tudor dresses. Well done for all the effort and preparation made by the staff.

I wanted to thank you all for your understanding and patience last week during the inclement weather days. It is always a difficult decision whether to close the school or not and one we have to take seriously bearing in mind the safety of the children and staff as well as the implications it may have on parents. Springfield Week

For our first Springfield week of the year we 'stepped back in time with Springfield.'

Ducklings looked at the **history of themselves**. They looked at themselves as babies and thought about what they would be when they grow up. They made self portrait spoons and used 2D shapes to make Picasso style portraits. They made handprints in the pop art style.

Pandas focused on **Space Exploration** and the moon landing. They did science experiments making their own craters, made rockets, did space role play and designed their own flags for when they landed on the moon.

Turtles learnt about Kings and Queens. They looked at King James I, the king on the throne when the tradition of Fireworks Night came about and made firework art. They also looked at Queen Elizabeth II, the monarch when they were born and King Charles III, the monarch when they started school. Turtles made their own crowns, palaces and carriages and created their own account of what they would do if they were King or Queen for the day.

Dolphins studied **Amelia Earhart , the Wright Brothers and flight.** They made fact clip recordings about Amelia Earhart and produced artwork looking down from an aeroplane.

Tigers were transported to **Roman** times looking at **Julius Caesar.** They made shields and mosaics, learnt Latin phrases and studied Roman numerals. They practiced marching with their shields.

Hedgehogs looked at the **Tudors and Henry VIII.** They created adverts for a new wife for Henry VIII and produced fact files about him. They drew symmetrical Tudor style portraits, made miniature Tudor portraits of themselves and created a Tudor banquet menu. **Frogs** travelled back to **Egyptian** times looking at **Tutankhamun and Cleopatra**. The classroom was transformed into a tomb and the class made cat mummies. They produced Pharaoh fact files, designed their own pharaoh headpieces and made a desert sand scene.

We were lucky enough to be visited by **Perform Drama** who delivered classes on the theme of 'Around the World'. King Charles III tasked them with travelling to countries around the world to find him a boomerang.
